Accessibility Scoping for New Construction and Alterations: What is Compliant, What to Modify & Which Regulations Apply?

Now that the 2013 CBC has been reformatted, melded with the 2010 ADA and enforceable for over a year, several essential elements must be clear to ensure effective use and application. This seminar will include a brief history of federal and state accessibility regulations; how to avoid lawsuits for both you and your clients; a discussion on what minimum and maximum really means; elements most often designed or installed incorrectly; scoping a project (including what regulations apply and where) and what to expect in the 2013 Intervening Code Adoption Cycle Supplement (effective July 1, 2015).
