Accessibility Scoping for New Construction and Alterations: What is Compliant, What to Modify & Which Regulations Apply?

Now that the 2013 CBC has been reformatted, melded with the 2010 ADA and enforceable for over a year, several essential elements must be clear to ensure effective use and application. This seminar will include a brief history of federal and state accessibility regulations; how to avoid lawsuits for both you and your clients; a discussion on what minimum and maximum really means; elements most often designed or installed incorrectly; scoping a project (including what regulations apply and where) and what to expect in the 2013 Intervening Code Adoption Cycle Supplement (effective July 1, 2015). There will also be a group break-out sessions and discussion. Attendees are encourage to submit specific topics to AIACV up to one week in advance of the presentation for the instructors to address. Accessibility Compliance - How to Avoid Costly Mistakes

This seminar is an advanced-level class which will present a methodical analysis of Chapter 11B of the California Building Code through case-studies of actual projects. This seminar will use pictures and floor plans to clarify the code requirements with an emphasis on how to avoid costly mistakes and possible legal action.

The seminar will be broken into eight parts: (1) Overview of Accessibility – The ADA, the CBC and Furniture (2) Plumbing Fixtures – Toilet Rooms, Sinks and Lavatories (3) A Building Official's Perspective (4) Medical Facilities – Hospitals and Medical Office Buildings (5) Alteration Projects – Path of Travel (6) Signage and Braille (7) 2016 CBC Code Updates (8) Exterior Areas – Parking, Passenger Loading Zones, Detectable Warnings, Ramps
